The National Association of Broadcaster (NAB) Annual Conference has over 1700 vendors spread across 1,000,000 sq. feet with over 100,000 attendees. If that is not comprehensible, join the club.

This was my 10th year but this one was different. Technology has been changing faster than ever before.

Drones had grown to needing 10 times the space of last year. The area for small first timers with 10'x20' space was packed with Korean knockoffs manufacturers. The major companies had spaces big enough to park 100 cars.

My task was to get past vendors to return to our conference and to look for new companies that fit the needs of our attendees. So I made a list of 64 vendors and then put together a schedule to maximize time with the vendors and minimize travel time. Now travel time may sound silly as a factor. The short answer is I walked about 6 miles in a span of 8 hours every day. That means mapping your travel across the four spaces. It never goes as planned because the person you want to see is not always available. You see, there are attendees from 68 countries that are ready to buy now. The first story I was told at NAB was that the guys with the briefcases trump everyone else.

This year I went with a different approach, "Show me the Money". Try to catch the biggest fish first and work my way down the list. So I ended up having to move quicker because they are all are a 10 to 20 minute walk from one to another. With each stop I was met with overwhelming support. That means new sponsors, new vendors, more involvement by JAG's Organizational Members, and solidifying plans for our drone demos. You will be hearing about all of these in the conference E-newsletter.

"Let me show you what's new." That was the greeting at each booth I visited. I learned that you can control your set lighting from your phone, that costs for equipment to do live remotes are within reach, that drone pilots are in demand and make 125K to 250K, that drone racing is the fastest growing sport in history, that 4K cameras will be everywhere, that PTZ cameras are getting smaller while the quality is getting better, and Network Device Interface (NDI) was what everyone was talking about.

I'm thinking that most of you are already registered for our conference and that is great, but you might want to call a colleague and tell them this is going to be a trade show not to be missed. Or you might want to talk to your boss about the career development opportunities and cost saving ideas the trade show has to offer.

I spent a total of 23 hours talking to vendors and looking at equipment but our trade show is only 7 hours long. With 20 product presentations, 7 drone fight demos, and 50 vendors to visit, I suggest you arrive at 9am when the doors open. And be ready for an exciting look at the future of communications. And learn about NDI. It is amazing.



While the trade show is free, it does not include the networking opportunities provided at our many events or the information you can find at our workshops. Many of our members would like to attend the conference but cannot get the funding necessary from their towns. JAG believes that the conference provides tools that you need to develop your station and gain the support of your governing body. Shadowstone has been a strong supporter of the PEG market and the Jersey Access group. By now, most of you have heard the news. On April 11th, 4Wall Entertainment Lighting, a national provider of stage and theatrical lighting services, acquired the assets of Shadowstone Inc. Personally, I'm happy to say that this will not affect the business, nor the relationships, that have been built between the members of JAG and Shadowstone over the past twelve years. In fact, it should allow it to grow even stronger.



The acquisition took place in the midst of our execution of our yearly participation in the National Association of Broadcasters convention as well as our planning for the Eastern Region Communication and Technology Conference. Having briefed the marketing department ahead of time, a meeting was held at our booth at NAB between me, Rich Desimone, and 4Wall's VP of Marketing, Wes Bailey. After just a few minutes, 4Wall had agreed to up Shadowstone's level of sponsorship of this event. Additionally, the 4Wall facility in Monachie, NJ, was made available for JAG meetings, workshops, and demonstrations. After the show, I encourage all of you to come visit our facility. While I was very proud of our Clifton headquarters, the 4Wall facility is massive....... Over 120,000 square feet of space which includes a beautiful demonstration facility. The next meeting we host will be a bit more comfortable for all of you than it had been in the Shadowstone warehouse!

The acquisition of Shadowstone is mutually beneficial to both entities. 4Wall is a large corporation providing system integration, rentals, and technical services. We have facilities in New York, New Jersey, Las Vegas, Los Angeles, Washington, DC, and Nashville. 4Wall primarily served the theatrical, event, and architectural markets, Shadowstone's primary areas of interest were the media markets, including the television, film, and videoconferencing. The acquisition allows both companies to more easily access vendors, equipment and resources that neither had before.

4Wall CEO Kathy Torjman spoke of the acquisition.

"Adding Shadowstone's team and equipment to our strong foundations in both the New York and Washington DC markets is a great benefit to our customers. Shadowstone has a loyal client base, as well as incredibly high standards for equipment and customer service that we share."

Frank Marsico, founded Shadowstone in 1993 and grew the company from the humblest of beginnings into a premium industry brand.

Shadowstone's rental division, which has experienced rapid growth in recent years, supplied lighting and electrical equipment to major Motion Pictures and TV productions nationwide including Law & Order SVU, The Blacklist, Gotham, Boardwalk Empire, The Amazing Spider Man 2, Black Mass, and Tower Heist.

The accomplished Shadowstone systems division has designed, built, or supplied major media projects including studio installations for Fox Network, ESPN, NBC Sports, ABC/Disney, EWTN and AOL, as well as government projects such as LED broadcast lighting systems for the White House Press Briefing Room and multiple US Senate Hearing Rooms.

In addition to the substantial equipment inventory gained through this acquisition, 4Wall will also retain Shadowstone's highly regarded and experienced team that has helped build the business into what it is today.

"We feel that the rental and systems staff we are bringing into the 4Wall fold from Shadowstone will be a great fit for our divisions, while also greatly expanding our company knowledge base in the film and television sector," said Torjman.

Frank Marsico spoke of the acquisition and the upcoming transition, saying:

"I would like to personally thank all of Shadowstone's clients, industry associates, friends, vendors, and especially the Shadowstone staff, for helping make the 'Shadowstone vision' a reality over the past 23 years. The Marsico family and our staff look forward to the new opportunities and growth that will come from joining the 4Wall organization.

On a personal note, I have enjoyed the friendships that I have developed while serving the JAG member organizations during these past twelve years with Shadowstone, and I look forward to serving you through 4Wall Entertainment.
