CONFESSIONS OF A LONELY VOLUNTEER

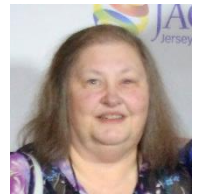

It was a balance that even professional dancers would appreciate. I look forward to attending our next conference in 2018.
