Cablecast Community Media Offers New Tools and Paths for Content Distribution Feature

What a difference a year makes. Last Fall I joined a group of JAG members for your December 2019 meeting. It really was a pleasure getting to see everyone in-person at the meeting. We were able to share ideas about a range of topics important to all of the PEG organizations, and I was able to demo our Cablecast Play-out server for the group. And...we all enjoyed some delicious Italian food together. Remember sharing food with friends? Remember sharing thoughts with other people, in a room, without masks ?



Ten months have passed, and we're all living in a different world. The need to communicate with one another is more critical now than it's ever been. And, from what I'm seeing in the marketplace, local PEG services are suddenly being used in new ways to help our communities monitor and participate in the important decisions coming before our local leaders. I've rejoined my own town's Communications Committee as we re-assess our video communications infrastructure and review how we distribute this important content to our local citizens. Again, what a difference a year makes. Suddenly, the email threads are growing long as more people jump into the discussions; Why can't we see what's happening in the High School on our local channel? I can't find the links on the town's web site to watch the meeting replays (Video On Demand). How can I watch these meetings if I no longer subscribe to cable TV? Sound familiar?

My job as a sales engineer for Tightrope's Cablecast Community Media division gives me a unique perspective on how our communities are responding to the kinds of questions I raise. Every day I talk with people like you who are working to find the best, most efficient way to connect organizations, and individuals, with their community using our legacy cable TV system. That's right, I'm referring to the "legacy" of cable TV in our country. You know the pitch. We collect Franchise Fees for the use of our community's right of ways. In exchange, we use some of these fees to manage "access" by non-commercial users under the headings Public, Educational and Government. These local PEG channel(s) form the technical pathways for us to share unique video content. But who's watching ?

In my little town the cable giant Charter/Spectrum came in and "slammed" our one PEG channel far up into the netherworld of an expanded digital network. If you didn't pay for the more expensive digital package, you probably could no longer watch our local programming. And even if you could, the image was compressed into a bad standard definition image. Our local council members complained that people were no longer watching, or engaging them as a result. What to do?

Well, in the State of Maine, we used our state organization (CTAM – Community Television Association of Maine) to introduce legislation that eventually became law forcing Charter (and all cable providers) to carry these PEG channels on the lowest tiers of programming, while providing an HD transmission path so that these local channels will match the technical quality of the other channels. Stay tuned as we wait for the First District Federal Court of appeals to hear the latest argument from the National Cable Television Association. If we prevail, the ruling will set a new national precedent and could eventually give JAG members an opportunity to request the same basic paths for content distribution in HD.

The other obvious solution is to provide new pathways for program distribution in our communities including live streaming and VOD to emerging video platforms like the internet, and Over The Top (OTT) platforms like AppleTV/Roku. Cablecast has responded with new tools to provide one-button distribution of your content to these emerging TV platforms. We also "spun up" a new cloud service for customers struggling with the distribution of Zoom meetings. Screenweave Live will take your meeting feeds and distribute the content to any platform you may be using, including Facebook or YouTube Live, while also pushing the content directly into your server and out to your cable provider, your web site, and AppleTV/Roku. We're able to provide this "heavy lifting" in the cloud through our Reflect service at a super competitive price providing a seamless delivery system for all of your content. I'm looking forward to seeing everyone, virtually, at your upcoming October 28th meeting. I look forward to continuing some of the conversations we started last year, and demonstrating some of the new features we're releasing on the Cablecast platform. We'll also provide some great gifts and new "swag" for participants, so please join us, and let's make this year a memorable meeting for all the right reasons. No masks required!

RE: Comments on the Statewide Renewal of Verizon. BPU Docket No. CE20080516



JAG - the Jersey Access Group, the non-profit organization representing local government, educational and public television channels throughout the state of New Jersey would like to submit our comments into the record regarding Verizon's New Jersey Statewide Franchise renewal.

Local PEG (Public, Education, Government) stations are main source for community communications, news and involvement with our municipal government officials and school boards. These PEG stations provide important information directly to our local residents. This fact couldn't be more apparent than during the current pandemic. PEG stations throughout the state have had to creatively redefine themselves in order to get vital messages out from their respective municipalities to the general public.

JAG would like the following concerns specific to Verizon franchise renewal to be considered:

1. HD (High Definition) Television has been around for over 15 years. By 2009, all television networks had switched to this amazing technology, except for PEG. PEG has been denied this technology and kept in the SD (Standard Definition) bottomless pit. The problem is, SD has gone away. Replacement equipment is no longer being made and impossible to obtain. PEG stations already have converted to HD equipment for content creation and play back, but now need to downgrade their signal to a substandard level for Verizon.

The Federal Cable Act states that we (PEG facilities) are not to be treated any differently from any other network/cable channel. It is evident in this situation that PEG channels are.
2. To go along with the first point, PEG also has not been allowed to list their programming in the channel guides. In a time where people search programming guides and record programs from information listed in them, PEG channels have been left out. Again, PEG is treated differently.
3. Verizon never completed their buildout as originally proposed. Many municipalities are in limbo as to whether it will ever happen. Many smaller communities are still in need cable competition and high speed internet access as promised by Verizon.
 - a. There are many communities in which Verizon has started buildout and has yet to complete it. Leaving portions of a municipality's residents in the dark when it comes to local government communication, especially during a pandemic, when they do not have access to the local PEG channel.
 - b. Municipalities are often left to wonder were there local channel broadcasts to, as there is no clearly defined service map showing exactly were each PEG station broadcasts to.
 - c. The lack of complete buildout in a community has left many municipalities and their stations in limbo. Many stations are broadcasting on the Verizon FiOS network, but because cable service has not been completed in their town, they cannot even get service to see their own PEG channel at their facility for oversight and quality control.
4. Currently, most local governments and PEG station managers, have no local government contact information within Verizon that they can reach out to in case of an outage, broadcast issues and general questions. We strongly urge the BPU to demand that Verizon provide local contact information to municipalities, PEG Stations and JAG Members.
5. Verizon has not adequately provided the proper production and post-production equipment (cameras, microphones, edit systems and more) as outlined in the original systemwide franchise agreement. In locations where they began to setup these repositories for equipment and training, municipalities were not notified of them, there is not clear and concise information on how to gain access to them and equipment currently on hand at them is outdated or no longer available.

As outlined in the Board of Public Utilities Guide to Cable Franchise Renewal, *"...is to examine the past performance of the cable operator and identify the future cable-related needs of the community."* We are *not* advocating that Verizon be refused their franchise renewal; rather, JAG respectfully requests that Verizon be held accountable to their original agreements and keep up with currently technology and trends such as High Definition Broadcast of PEG channel. We believe this inequity must be rectified.

A relatively new station by JAG standards, we're only five years old and it has been a struggle to get the town's mayor and administrator to recognize the value of the channel. We have made some progress in getting our municipal officials to recognize the value of our station, but ironically, the current health crisis has given us a chance to demonstrate the true value of the channel.



While most of the events that we would normally cover have been cancelled, there have been several things that we have been able to do that have kept our citizens informed and allowed us to prove our value to the township. Like most municipal channels, we provided the only window into the activities in the township by televising our town council meetings. These meetings were a combination of a live gathering in the council chambers with the mayor and a couple of council members and conference call number that could be used by both council members and members of the public. We streamed these meetings live so those wishing to participate from their homes were able to both follow the proceedings and call in to make comments at the appropriate time. Our solution did not include a Zoom type alternative, but rather just a speaker phone and a microphone in the council chamber—decidedly low tech, but it did the job. In addition, we used our Community Bulletin Board to provide graphic information on Covid-19 including hand washing instructions, food safety procedures, and testing locations. We also carried the Governor's press conference in its entirety each day to provide our citizens information from the state on the health crisis.

As in many towns, there are certain ceremonies that occur year after year that contribute a sense of normalcy. We at our little underfunded station here in West Milford helped people in the town feel that sense of normalcy by broadcasting a Memorial Day tribute from our Mayor to those who lost their lives in defense our country. We also carried our socially distant and sparsely attended 9/11 Memorial service so folks in our town can never forget.

With no library events to cover, no 4th of July fireworks or parade, no lectures at the local museum and no cooking classes at the Shop Rite, there has been precious little to remind people of life before the health crisis. WM77, in its own modest way, has delivered important information to a community in need of a sense of normalcy. The mayor has expressed her appreciation for the work we've done and we've even convinced the town to invest in a LiveU unit that will allow us to stream from any location within the township. Perhaps there is an upside to this pandemic, but I'd gladly trade the gains we've made for an end to the health crisis.
